Since inception, the organization has had a special focus for children, especially those from marginalized communities and the HIV/AIDS infected or affected children. To address the needs of children comprehensively, FXBIS follows an **'Integrated Development'** approach model, wherein it designs programmes on livelihood, health and education for the community as a whole, so that the vulnerable, especially women and children are provided a safe, healthy and sustainable environment to thrive in. Our four domains of interventions, namely, Livelihood Promotion, Access to Quality Education, Improved Health Status, and Protection & Safety, together exert to create a net of protection and welfare in the community we intervene.

FXBIS began its operations in 2007, as a registered Indian entity under Section 8 of the Companies Act 1956, modified under section 8 of the Companies Act, 2013 with an objective of assisting people to lead a life of dignity by creating safe, healthy and productive environment. It is currently working in the states of Delhi, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Jharkhand, Assam, Manipur, Meghalaya, Andhra Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, West Bengal and 1 UT, Puducherry.

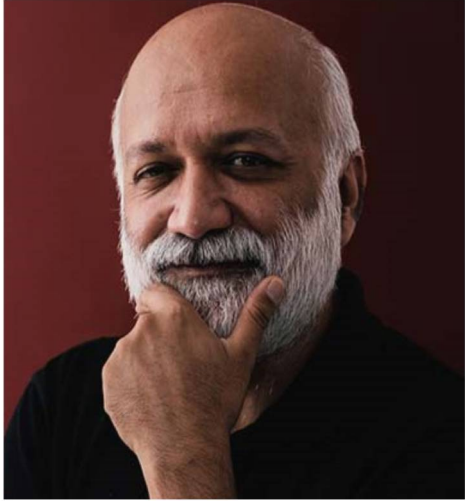
In 2020-21, FXB India Suraksha directly reached out to more than 200000 population in 12 states through its interventions on Health, Education, Livelihoods and Protection and Safety for Women and Children. Our efforts to improve earnings of marginalized rural women took a big leap as through our programmes, we have engaged more than 2000 women in improved livestock management and helped about 100 women farmers to earn consistent incomes through vegetable production and marketing as part of our model kitchen garden farming program in Assam and Meghalaya.

The fury of Covid-19 during the first and second wave nationwide was devastating, FXB India Suraksha in solidarity with the affected communities, battled against time to carry out massive humanitarian responses to ensure our continued presence in delivering immediate relief to over 20000 families, sanitary and hygienic supplies to about 1 lakh population. COVID offered us several lessons- the biggest being that of the strength of resilience and the power of collaboration for a common cause.

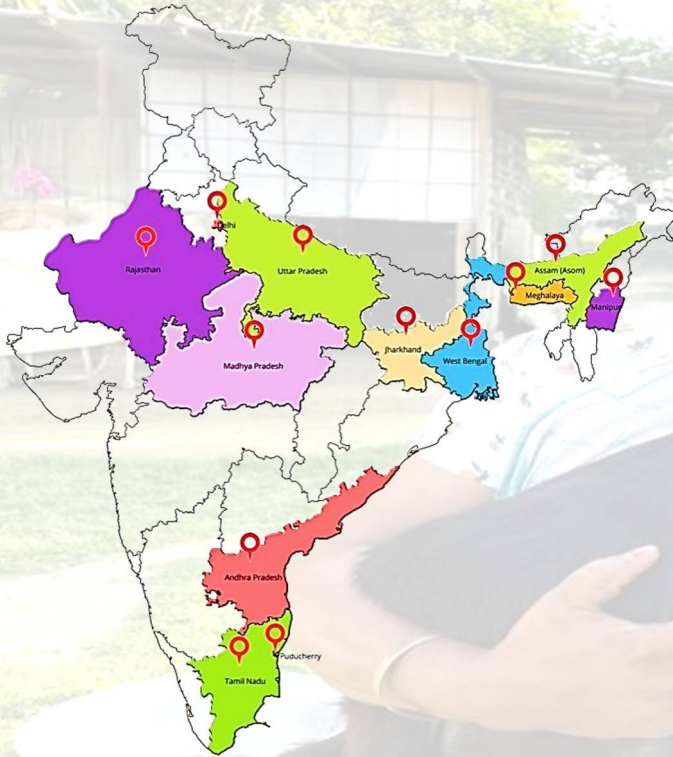


### MR. MANISH DUBEY

## DOMAINS OF WORK

### LIVELIHOOD PROMOTION

FXB India Suraksha envisions an India in which women and families lead self-reliant and empowered lives of dignity. With this vision, FXBIS has been enabling skill-based employment opportunities for women and youth and strengthened individual and community-based capacities to run and grow the businesses.

FXBIS focuses on reviving traditional livelihood avenues using local resources and transference of technology. Women members of the FXBIS Self Help Groups (SHGs) participate in comprehensive training programmes which equip them with the skills to sustainably run their businesses. SHGs are linked with cooperatives, financial institutions and government schemes for micro-financing opportunities; besides the linkages with market opportunities for products and services facilitated by FXBIS state teams considering the regional nuances. In addition FXBIS is helping farmers to access advance farm techniques, tools and equipment and increasing agricultural productivity and returns.



### ACCESS TO QUALITY EDUCATION



FXB India Suraksha believes in universal access to quality education as the key to effective and sustainable social change. The FXBIS education strategy aims to enhance access to and the quality of education across socio-economic strata. We help local schools to improve their infrastructure and basic amenities besides helping families in need to raise funds for school education and we link them to government education schemes.

In the **20** Suraksha Education Centres spread across rural and urban slums in India, children can access supplementary educational support from trained local educated volunteers through innovative Teaching Learning Materials. FXBIS computer literacy Centres bridge the digital divide among the youth. FXBIS empowers women and youth through non-formal education programmes, 'Life Skill Workshops' and vocational training courses.

### IMPROVED HEALTH STATUS

FXB India Suraksha recognizes that good health is a fundamental human right and a precondition for social development. A paramount objective of all FXBIS programmes is to address health vulnerabilities by improving access to quality health services, clean water and sanitation facilities within its intervention geographies.

The overall impact of the FXBIS health strategy is a significant decrease of communicable and vector borne diseases as well as infant, maternal and child mortality rates within communities of intervention. FXBIS' comprehensive health agenda includes direct support in form of health camps, care and support services for people living with HIV/AIDS (PLHIV), supplementary nutrition, awareness and counseling besides facilitating construction of low-cost toilets and access to safe drinking water in urban slums and rural areas.



### PROTECTION AND SAFETY



An integral part of all FXBIS programmes is to prevent and reduce all forms of violation and exploitation of children and women which includes gender-based violence, human trafficking, child labour, child marriages, commercial sexual exploitation and incidences of stigma and discrimination within its programme geographies. The ultimate objective is to create a safe, secure and protective environment for women and children.

The FXBIS Protection and Safety strategy focuses on preventive measures through building capacities among adolescents and community members, raise awareness and stakeholder sensitization programmes. FXBIS works with the local youth, girls and boys, to train them as peer educators and build a cadre for agents of change within their own communities. Survivors of violence are assisted through immediate intervention and link with central and state sponsored services for their rehabilitation through referral, after care and counseling services.

## REGION WISE PROJECTS UPDATES



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### PROGRAMMES IN NORTH INDIA

#### **Childline 1098 GautamBudh Nagar, Uttar Pradesh**

CHILDLINE 1098 is a 24/7 emergency phone outreach service for children in need of care and protection linking them to emergency and long-term care and rehabilitation services. FXBIS is implementing this project in Gautam Budh Nagar District in the State of **Uttar Pradesh**. During the outbreak of Covid 19 in 2020, FXBIS was nominated as the Nodal agency to work with the district administration in addressing the health crisis situation in the district especially in Noida which is a hub for migrant population. Over 20,000 persons were provided with ration relief and children with emergency support and assistance

#### **SAAMYA (GautamBudh Nagar, Uttar Pradesh)**

The project is implemented in three areas of Gautam Budh Nagar district namely Mamura, Desai Gaon and Ghadi Chaukhandi. The objective of the project is to foster young boys towards a gender equitable society by building their understanding on gender through structured training, creating change agents and improving the support systems through advocacy. Under the project, a module has been developed to sensitize boys within the age group of 8-11 years on gender inclusive society.

#### **Railway Platform Children's Programme (Jaipur, Rajasthan)**

FXBIS is running a day-care center for children living in the platform and adjacent street of the Jaipur Railway station. The center is situated near the Jaipur railway station where children come to rest, eat, clean, play and learn in a protective environment. The goal of the program is to improve the living conditions of street children living in Jaipur Railway station and to empower them to lead a life of dignity. However, due to Covid 19 outbreak, the day care center had to be kept closed abiding by the national and state protocols, leading to shift in the execution of project activities. The project team visited the children in their living areas to provide them educational support and nutrition. Project team cooked food themselves and distributed amongst children during lunch time. Also, 346 families were provided with dry ration kits and dry milk for infants.

#### **Suraksha Sustainable Learning Program (SSLP): Strengthen capacity of law enforcement agencies to effectively combat human trafficking in Madhya Pradesh**

FXB India Suraksha with the support of British High Commission, Delhi implemented this project in Madhya Pradesh. The objective of the project is to enable proactive and efficient state law enforcement responses and interventions to combat human trafficking in the state. In the process, Over 428 Police officials of the rank of Sub Inspector and Constables consisting both male and female police officials' capacities were strengthened on human trafficking and child protection.



## PROGRAMMES IN NORTHEAST & EAST INDIA

### Holistic Rural Development Project (HRDP), Ri-Bhoi District, Meghalaya & Assam

FXB is implementing 3 Holistic Rural Development projects that is one in Ri-Bhoi District of Meghalaya State, one in Kamrup District and one in Darrang District of Assam State. The goal of this is to help poor tribal and backward communities to improve their standard of living and thereby achieve the inclusive and integrated development of targeted villages. FXBIS is implementing this programme with financial support of HDFC Bank CSR with core interventions on livelihoods, education, health, new and renewable energy and infra development. These 3 HRDP Programmes are engaged in holistic development of 17 villages in total.

### School Sanitation Project (ITC), Assam

FXBIS has joined hands with ITC CSR in 2020 April to implement its flagship programme namely school sanitation programme in 2 districts of Assam viz. Kamrup rural and Darrang. The programme is implemented in 22 schools in 18 revenue villages spread across 3 blocks. The goal of the school WASH project is to help children realize their full potential of development through improved WASH and Health practices in schools with enhanced community support.

### Mukti Programme (Pan India with detailed focus in Manipur, West Bengal and Delhi)

FXBIS is implementing Mukti project in Manipur to reduce the incidence of trafficking in persons in India. The purpose of the project is to reduce the incidence of trafficking in persons for commercial sexual exploitation, particularly of children, in trafficking source and Destination states (**Manipur, West Bengal and Delhi**) of India.

### Childline 1098 Ukhrul, Manipur)

CHILDLINE 1098 is a 24/7 emergency phone outreach service for children in need of care and protection linking them to emergency and long-term care and rehabilitation services. FXBIS is implementing this project in Ukhrul district of Manipur state.

### Combatting Trafficking in Persons in North India

FXBIS with the support of US Embassy, Delhi is implementing this project in three districts of Uttar Pradesh-Gautam Budh Nagar, Meerut and Ghaziabad. It aims to train around 150 police officials to efficiently address the issue of human trafficking. In this regard FXBIS developed a Hindi translated anti-TIP law enforcement training module/handbook to be used by UP Police for effective intervention and investigation of trafficking cases.





## PROGRAMMES IN SOUTH INDIA

### Care and Support for People Living with HIV/AIDS (PLHA)

A comprehensive care, treatment and support project is implemented for people living with HIV/AIDS and their families in **Visakhapatnam, Andhra Pradesh**. This project is benefiting 82 HIV/AIDS affected families during the reporting period. A group of affected women are running Mutually Aided Co-operative Society (MACS) offering financial services to help them establish small businesses and make additional earnings.

### FXBIS Integrated Rural Development Programme, Villupuram District, Tamilnadu

FXBIS is implementing its Core project helping poor rural households to improve their socio economic status and improved access to welfare & development scheme offered by various Government Department for socially and economically backward communities in the selected 5 villages of **Villupuram District in Tamilnadu**.

### Comprehensive Children Development Programme through Transforming Government Schools(Integrated Community Development Programme), Pondicherry

This project is being implemented in 5 Schools in rural **Pondicherry** covering 1378 children. The objective of this project is to improve the basic amenities and provide learning friendly environment in local Government run schools and also groom soft skills among children of these schools. This project also engaged in desilting of local water channel benefiting thousands of farmer and villagers for irrigation and to recharge ground water. In addition team is engaged with Govt. Health Department and other local NGO network in fight against Covid-19 during the reporting period



## GLIMPSES OF IMPACT 2020-21

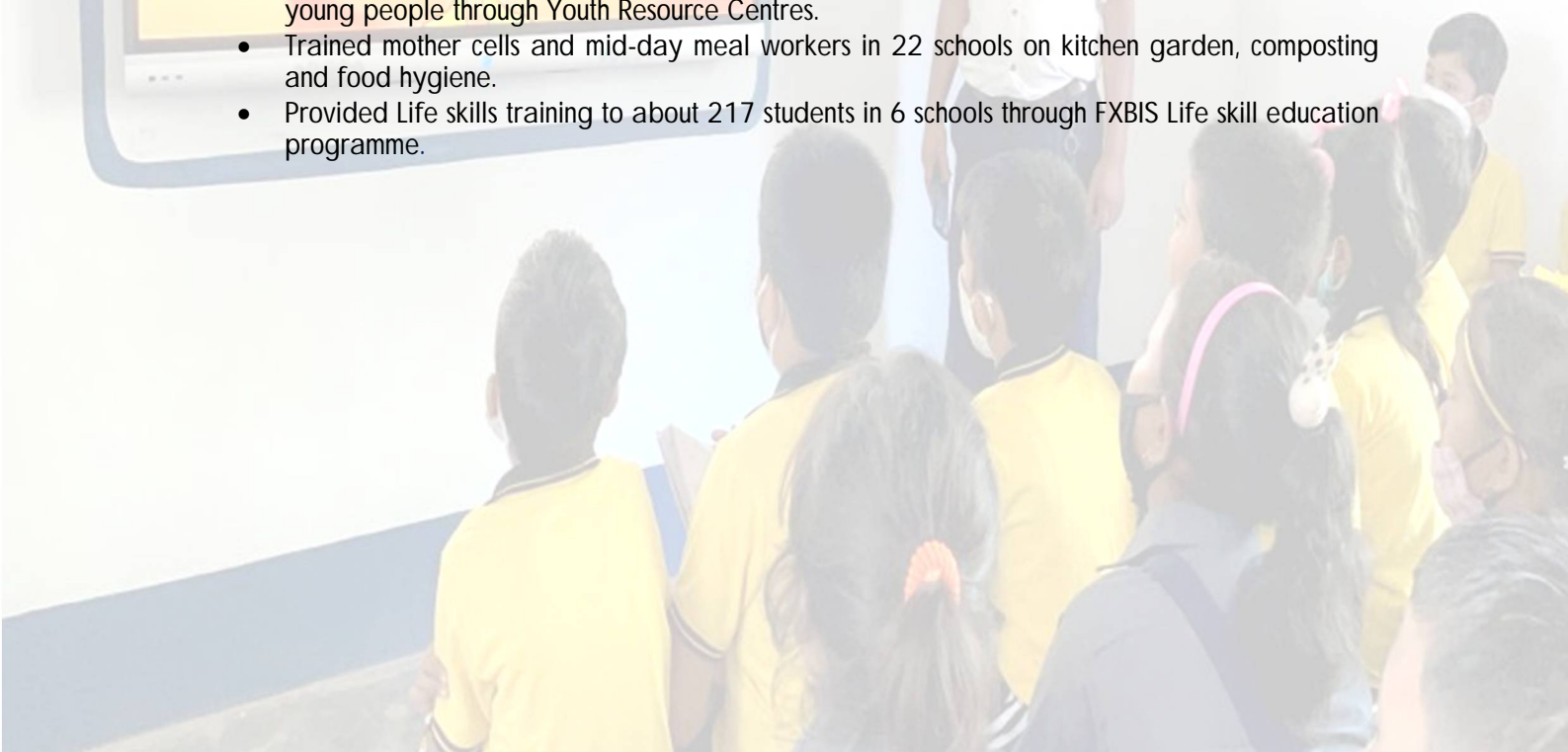
### **LIVELIHOOD PROMOTION**

- FXBIS team had reached out to over 2000 women with Entrepreneurship Development Programme and assisted the aspiring women entrepreneurs to take up various home based enterprises and make additional earnings.
- Facilitated career guidance, skill building and employment opportunities to over 1000 youth through 4 Youth Resource Centres and digital literacy programme.
- Promoted profitable farming to over 1000 farmers through promotion of various improved farm practices like integrated farming, trellis, mulching, and poly houses and inter cropping.
- Promoted weaving clusters and facilitated skill building, tools and market linkages to over 300 weavers.
- Created secondary income for more than 500 households through improved livestock management in goatery, piggery and poultry.
- Connected 25 villages with regular veterinary services improving their livestock productivity
- About 105 farmers in Kamrup district of Assam and Ri-Bhoi District of Meghalaya have achieved more 30% production of paddy through SRI an fishery integration method
- Organized capacity building workshops for existing SHGs and formed new SHGs as per need in project villages benefiting over 1000 women.
- Installed 5 solar irrigation pumps benefiting 60 farmers and got 100 bighas of land under yearlong cultivation in Assam.
- FXBIS team has linked-up around 130 farmers with KVK paddy demonstration program and around 15 hectares comes under the demonstration program.
- About 23 farmer clubs formed and over 400 farmers gaining collective benefit through these farmer groups and 17 Agriculture Resource Centres
- Projects have installed 80 solar street lights in 11 villages where there is no provision of lights and distributed solar home lights to 50 household that have no access to electricity.



### **ACCESS TO QUALITY EDUCATION**

- Developed 36 schools and 9 Anganwadis as learning friendly in Darrang and Kamrup Districts of Assam, Ri-Bhoi district of Meghalaya and Puducherry
- Upgraded 8 schools in Assam and Meghalaya as smart schools with digital equipment and internet for learning
- Facilitated competencies based teaching for over 1000 first generation learners from poor to marginalized communities through 20 Suraksha Education Centres across the country.
- 28 school dropout children have been sent back to school.
- Provided computer skills to 470 students through Digital Learning Centre.
- Engaged and activated 25 School Management Committees (SMCs) towards effective monitoring of quality education and facilities in their respective Villages.
- Mindfulness training was conducted for 100 young people in Villages of Ri-Bhoi District Meghalaya
- Soft skill and personality development programme was organised and benefited about 250 young people through Youth Resource Centres.
- Trained mother cells and mid-day meal workers in 22 schools on kitchen garden, composting and food hygiene.
- Provided Life skills training to about 217 students in 6 schools through FXBIS Life skill education programme.





### **IMPROVED HEALTH STATUS**

- About 15000 people got exposed to Behaviour Change communication and received knowledge on Mother and Child Health, Communicable diseases, health services, Nutrition and WASH.
- Delivered health services to 440 people through general health camps.
- 82 families of People Living with HIV/AIDS (PLHIVs) received care and treatment service through FXBIS Care and Support center in Visakhapatnam
- MCH follow-up interventions Ensured 100% adherence to mandatory ANC/PNC Check-ups and institutional deliveries for 801 mothers in our project area.
- Nurtured 73 young para medical volunteers to guide and help remote rural population with knowledge on precautionary measures against communicable and non-communicable diseases, first aid and referral services to health care providers
- Provided 5375 meals to children at FXBIS day care centre in Jaipur for poor homeless children.
- Distributed 4288 Sanitary pads to adolescent girls in Government schools and Noida slums.
- Installed 28 kitchen/herbal gardens serving vegetables to schools and Anganwadis and Organized nutrition demonstration sessions to 149 mothers promoting consumption of nutritious food for children.
- Promoted access to household toilets to 206 families by assisting them to construct and renovate toilets.
- Provided functional toilets, hand washing, water supply and facilities for menstrual hygiene in 22 schools in Assam benefiting over 4000 students.





## **PROTECTION AND SAFETY**

- 32 children and adolescents' clubs were formed in the intervention villages of Darrang in Assam and Ukhrul district in Manipur to empower them as change agents to address issues related to children.
- FXBIS Manipur team assisted Ujjwala Centers in Imphal by counselling 20 survivors of human trafficking belonging to Nepal team .
- In partnership with Department of Social Welfare, Government of Manipur, produced a musical video named "Emagi Phiji Marumda" as an awareness tool to observe World Day Against Trafficking in Persons, 2020. The video was uploaded in Youtube have been viewed by over 50,000 viewers and still counting.
- 14 vulnerable/potential victim(s) or survivors of gender-based violence and human trafficking were provided with economic rehabilitation in Darjeeling, West Bengal. A food business initiative with the name *We Kitchen* was started to support three women to sell cooked and packaged pickle. Moreover, few vulnerable girls were identified belonging to trafficking prone areas and were supported with piggy farming.
- Above 1500 persons (law enforcement officials, paramilitary officials government child protection actors, parents, teachers, adolescents, community leaders like village headmen and religious leaders, journalists) were sensitized and trained on issues related to child protection, human trafficking and violence against children especially child sexual abuse.
- Around 120 boys were sensitized to adopt gender equal behaviour through a structured module under Saamya Project in Gautam Budh Nagar district, Uttar Pradesh.
- Assam Rifles adopted and integrated FXBIS' training tools on human trafficking and child protection in their in-service training course conducted for the newly recruited personnel.
- FXBIS was invited as resource person to train investigation officers, other police officials and prosecutors in the training programs organized by Central Academy for Police Training, Madhya Pradesh and Central Detective Institute for Police Training, Ghaziabad. Over 2000 law enforcement officials were trained.
- FXBIS in association with Madhya Pradesh Police conducted a vulnerability mapping exercise of hotspots prone to human trafficking using a structured questionnaire in Madhya Pradesh.
- FXBIS was selected as a Host organization by IBM to set up Trafficking Analysis Hub in India to support organization in prevention from trafficking especially for forced labour.
- FXBIS' thematic expert on Protection and Safety of women and children, Mr. Satya Prakash, Chief Operating Officer, was selected as a fellow for the prestigious International Visitor Leadership Program (IVLP) by the US State Department, 2020-2021.



## MONITORING & EVALUATION – RESEARCH & ADVOCACY

### **Feasibility & Needs Assessment Scoping Study- Darrang HRDP-II**

At the time of HRD Programme initiation, FXBIS as an implementing agency has conducted a very comprehensive scoping study to understand the demographics, socioeconomic, health and education conditions and existing village infrastructure. Further the study has conducted assessment of the current status of development, community needs and scope to implement Holistic Rural Development Programme interventions more effectively and in a meaningful manner.

### **Baseline Assessment Study- ITC School WASH Programme**

In order to assess the current WASH situation in the selected schools and set achievable targets for the project, FXBIS has conducted Baseline Study in July 2020 in selected 20 schools of Darrang and Kamrup districts and linked village community in Assam.

### **Scoping Study of prevalence of Human Trafficking in Madhya Pradesh with special focus on Bhopal and Mandsaur district (2019-2020)**

This study was carried out under the project 'Strengthening capacity of law enforcement agencies in Madhya Pradesh to combat Human Trafficking' which focused on the understanding the trends, phenomenon and challenges faced by law enforcement agencies in handling cases of trafficking in persons in Madhya Pradesh. The study was conducted in two districts of Madhya Pradesh- Bhopal and Mandsaur-considering its vulnerability, one being the capital of the state and an emerging source, transit and destination for trafficking in persons while the other infamous for the traditional practice of prostitution in the Mandsaur-Neemuch highway in the state respectively.

### **Action Research to prevent child trafficking and sexual abuse in Santhal Pargana, Jharkhand**

FXBIS with the support of Oak Foundation is implementing a two-year action research project to understand the underlying factors leading children and young girls at risk to getting exploited in the Santhal Pargana region of Jharkhand. The aim of the project is to study the vulnerabilities, assess the institutional support systems and then develop a comprehensive program/action plan to create a safe and protected environment for children in the region. A consortium of partners in the name of Damin Initiative for the Young and Adolescent (DIYA) was formed along with local NGOs namely Pravah, Sathee and Jharkhand Vikas Parishad to roll out the research. Moreover, in order to establish grassroots ownership of the research, a regional and block level committee representing communities/local institutions was formally chartered with the name Damin Bal Suraksha Sahyog Samiti (Committee on promoting Child Protection in Damin Area). However, due to the outbreak of Covid 19, the research came to a halt but resumed its activities from January 2021. A baseline survey was conducted in total 3000 households in the three districts namely Pakur, Dumka and Godda in the region.

### **Rapid Assessment to understand the impact of Covid 19 in the Santhal Pargana, Jharkhand**

This study was part of the above-mentioned Action Research. Albeit the challenges, the consequent effect of the pandemic in form of job losses and streams of reverse migration of the people - from cities to their native places, made the consortium partners jointly decide on conducting a rapid assessment on the impact of the pandemic on the people of the Santhal Pargana. The rapid assessment was carried out with the help of Focused Group Discussions (FGDs) and Key Informant Interviews (KIIs) with several stakeholders- adolescents, Gram Sabhas, in-migrants, ICDS, SHGs, etc.

### **Identify Promising Practices and Challenges in Integrating or Separating Services for Victims of Human Trafficking and Gender Based Violence**

The research is informed by secondary data and literature analysis, legal framework study and, qualitative analysis through key informant interviews (KIIs), focus group discussions (FGDs), and case studies gathered from six states in India where the study was carried out- Delhi, Goa, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra and Manipur. 70 key informant interviews with the- law enforcement officials (police, prosecutors, judges, and border officials), service providers (shelter homes, NGOs, and government officials), and victims (TIP and GBV) were conducted to arrive at the findings and recommendations. The study is premised upon a deeper study of the intersections between TIP and GBV, its resultant impact on the identification of victims, leading to a concluding exploration of effective service delivery to the victims, and whether these stand in need of integration.





# COVID-19 RESPONSE

Within days of the nationwide lockdown declared on 24th March 2020, FXBIS along with a few partner organizations, started working strategically towards addressing the problems emerging with the pandemic. Starting 27th March, FXBIS had taken over relief work in all 11 states and union territories where it has its presence.

FXBIS was nominated as nodal NGO for coordinating Covid-19 relief operations in Gautam Buddha Nagar district and we were able to gather immense support from local pradhanas, transgender activists, community-based organizations, police and the local youth in the distribution of supplies and maintaining social order.

In the union territory of Puducherry FXB India Suraksha had responded to the Covid crisis and joined hands with Government Health & Family Welfare and other like-minded Network organizations like #CovidActionCollab and Corporate Agencies such as Whirlpool Of India Ltd, Godrej etc.

Ms. Mamta Borgoyary, Chief Executive Officer handed over 70000 hand sanitizers to Govt. of Pondicherry with the hands of Dr.Tamilisai Soundarajan, Honorable Lieutenant Governor of Puducherry on 31st March 2021.

- 50000 individuals reached out through tele-counseling and other direct field related activities promoting Covid care behavior, vaccination and treatment.
- Provided dry ration kits and dry milk for infants to over 20000 affected poor households in various parts of the country during the lockdown.
- Coordinated and handed over the health care kits to Government of Pondicherry such as face masks- 8190, Accu-ChekOsugar-5, Face shield-440, ICU Cots-6, ICU Ventilators-1, Infra-red Therrmometer-1, Pulse Oxometers-60, Oxygen Concentrators-25, PPE Kits-1577, Steller 150- etc.



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- 74 youth from project villages registered as volunteers (Pratirodhi Bandhu Volunteer) in Darrang district in response to the call by Assam Disaster Management Agency to fight against COVID- 19.
- Developed and delivered IEC materials on Vaccination such as banners, posters & handbills - 50 banners & 5000 posters & 20000 handbills.
- Organized about 200 group meetings in street corners.
- Conducted 48 Hours vaccine marathon and vaccine festivals reaching out to about 40000 people every day.
- Helped about 4000 people to book their slot using cowin website.
- Conducted about 2000 Door to Door vaccination campaigns and mobilized people breaking and convincing on their myths and misconceptions.
- Messages on covid and vaccination on milk packets therefore reaching out to homes directly - 1 lac milk packets in a day in 2 different times.
- 5 Special camps and sessions at villages, schools and sub centre etc.
- Organized 20 mobile vaccine camps for those who could not travel to PHC.
- Held a lucky draw schemes (such as movie tickets etc) encouraging vaccination.
- Announcements using loud speakers in auto rickshaws for 10 days.



### Effective psycho social support/counseling for CCL (Children in Conflict with the law)

**FXBIS Child line team Ukhrul received a letter seeking** counseling for group of 21 girls and 3 boys who were seen engaged in a group fight on 14 July 2020. The video of the following act was circulated in social media. FXB team helped them to reflect on their behavior that led to the incident and grow insight from it through 3 months psycho social counseling sessions. By the end of the sessions the groups testified that they had learned a great deal from the social support group. They have become friends now and their families expressed gratitude for the counseling and support offered by the FXBIS team. Children club is also formed in the village in which these girls and boys are involved in child safety awareness campaigns on child abuse and educating their peers on children's rights. This is a fine example of restorative justice delivered to children in conflict with the law.



### Traditional weaver enhanced skills making earnings through diversified products



Ms. DhanadaKalita is one among the women in KhasDipila village engaged in weaving activity. She was doing weaving traditionally with limited weaving arrangements. She was one among the beneficiary who was trained in improved designs and new techniques by FXBIS with the support of HDFC Parivartan. She was also assisted with material support like wooden frame and Jacquard machine to improve her weaving unit. Now she is able to give her maximum time in weaving and producing more products in lesser amount of time and earns

around Rs 8500/- per month. During Covid Lockdown, this weaving unit only fetched the family with all financial needs of the family. Ms. Dhanadakilita is also assisting other women in the villages with required technical inputs.

### Child Labour Rescued

FXBIS child line team in GautamBudh Nagar received a case of Child Labour where a minor girl is engaged in domestic labour work in an apartment in Noida. After verifying the case, CHILDLINE team has written to Labour Department and AHTU Team to rescue the Child. Then the team along with Govt. officials had rescued the Child along with other two children and facilitated medical checkups as some marks of torture were found on their bodies and then shifted to a Shelter home on CWC's order. Written complaint was given to CWC with the counselling report to take appropriate action against the employer and FIR was registered against the employer. Later, CWC handed over the children to their parents after receiving NOC from concerned departments.



## Schools improved WASH facilities improving enrolment and attendance of students in Rural Kamrup



In Kamrup rural, hundreds of schools donot have proper WASH facilities making children vulnerable and low attendance to schools. FXB India Suraksha with the support of ITC-MSK implemented School WASH Program in 12 schools in Kamrup district. The project initiatives have ensured safe and hygiene toilet blocks separately for boys and girls, Hand Washing station, proper dining area, improved kitchen with running water facility. Additionally,

intense BCC and awareness programmes were organized both in schools and in the community, activated school institutions like Mother cells, SMDC, Children Clubs. With these initiatives in the year-II enrolment increased over 25% in all schools. Mr. Banajit Kalita, Head Master of one such school reported that the enrolment increased from 376 to 480 after these facilities where provided especially girls enrolment is high.

## Cops to help minor rape survivors

**NOIDA:** The district police have decided to launch an initiative to help minor rape survivors through counselling and rehabilitation. Under the initiative, titled "Sakhi", trained women police personnel (counsellors) will soon identify minor rape survivors in the city and visit them at their homes in Noida and Greater Noida to counsel them and help them overcome the trauma.

Vrinda Shukla, DCP, Women Safety, Gautam Budh Nagar, said rape is a serious crime which needs to be checked. "We have formed a special team of 20 women police personnel – 15 sub-inspectors and five head constables. These sub-inspectors are also the investigating officials (IO) in most of the rape cases. For Saturday, we have scheduled a day-long training programme for these personnel. We have invited doctors and psychiatrists from government and private sectors to provide training and sensitise them. The personnel will be trained on how to talk to the survivors and counsel them properly," Shukla said.

She said rape affects survivors mentally. "The police will also help victims who would need medical treatment, psychiatrists or proper medication," she said. Initially police will focus on minor survivors; the initiative would cover older survivors

later. Teams will analyse cases registered in August and September to select cases.

Police said they are figuring out the total number of rape cases registered this year. Shukla said there are also some instances where fake charges of rape were levelled by complainants. "Probe in some cases revealed that allegations were not correct. We will screen complaints and address only serious cases under this initiative," she said. The counsellors will visit the survivors' houses from Monday.

Mala Bhandari, founder of Noida-based women's rights non-government organisation SADRAG, said survivors need to be counselled with sympathy and empathy. "Police should also engage some expert counsellors for this initiative," she said.

Satya Prakash, programme manager of FXB India Suraksha – Childline, an NGO that works for child rights, said that counselling is a must in such cases. "Most police personnel are not specially trained to deal with rape survivors. We have found that the survivors experience mental suffering in such cases. There were some instances where the survivors tried to hurt themselves. The Sakhi initiative should not be limited to counselling only. The police should also ensure counselling of victims' families, ensure compensation, and medical health services, etc., to the victim in an integrated programme," he said.

# Noida: Newborn found abandoned

**NOIDA:** A newborn baby boy was found abandoned near a drain on Saturday morning by a passerby, in Sector 15A. The child was sent for medical treatment while efforts are on to trace the family, said the police.

The incident came to light around 10am when a passerby heard the cries of the newborn, who was wrapped in a blanket. A call was made to the police helpline and the Child Line was also alerted. "A PCR van reached took the child to the district hospital. Doctors said the baby is less than a day old. He is undergoing treatment but is stable and under observation for now," said Rakesh Kumar Singh, SHO, Sector 20 police station. Police said efforts are being

made to trace his family.

The new born will be handed over to Child Line for now, as decided by the Child Welfare Committee. Later, he will be sent to an orphanage in Mathura, unless his family is found.

"There is no trace of the family yet but we are working with the police to identify it. The baby is doing well," said Satya Prakash, programme manager, FXB India Suraksha, the NGO running the district child line.

In April 2020, a four-day-old girl child was found abandoned near the Parthla roundabout. In July, a six-month-old female foetus was found in Bhangel. Families could not be traced in any of these cases yet.

## As lockdown rules ease, child labour cases go up

**NOIDA:** With the gradual lifting of restrictions, cases of child labour and missing children have seen a steady rise in June compared to the lockdown months.

In June, six child labour related cases were reported to the Childline in Gautam Budh Nagar compared to none in April and two in May. There were 18 such cases in March before the first phase of lockdown was announced to contain the Covid-19 spread.

"As the situation is coming back to normal, these issues will keep on increasing. With more

restrictions being lifted, the number of child labour cases will also be on the rise," said Satya Prakash, programme manager, FXB India Suraksha, an NGO that manages the helpline in GB Nagar.

Childline-1098-isa 24x7 helpline number for children in distress.

Prakash said that most of these cases were from the unorganised sector establishments like local eateries or grocery shops, though one case was of an underage domestic help.

"Most of the migrants who had left for their home towns are now coming back. Even though many of them are avoiding coming back

with families, a few will use all members, including children, to earn some money. Besides, the closure of schools due to the pandemic is also adding to the problem," he said.

The cases of missing children have also gone up from five in April and four in May to 12 in June.

"On average, we receive about 1,100 intervention calls in a year. However, the figure will definitely be much higher this year as the patterns suggest," said Prakash.

Police officers admitted that there is a rise in the child labour cases in the district. "On Friday itself we received two tips on

child labour cases in Greater Noida. As economic activities resume, more of such instances might come to light," said Vrinda Shukla, deputy commissioner of police (women and child safety).

PK Singh, district labour commissioner, said, "We have a task force which acts on the information about child labour cases. We coordinate with anti-human trafficking unit, Childline, and police, and conduct raids if the need be. The rescued children are then taken to shelter homes for counselling, and are presented before the Child Welfare Committee before being sent back to their families."

The number of help calls to the

Childline had more than doubled in April in the beginning of the lockdown. Most of these revolved around requests for nutrition of children.

"Needy people were receiving food from various social organisations or the government. But we were receiving requests for milk and baby food. We are still receiving such requests. It is a new pattern and wasn't there before the lockdown," said Prakash.

The total number of intervention calls, which also include counselling of children, among others, also went up to 28 in June compared to 20 in April and 24 in May, he said.

बाल मजदूरी रोकने के लिए तमाम तरह के प्रयास किए जाते हैं। इसके बावजूद इस पर पूरी तरह रोक नहीं लग पाई है। इसकी वजह गरीब परिवारों की मजबूरी है। आर्थिक तंगी की वजह से बच्चों को काम पर भेजना पड़ता है। कई परिवार प्लेसमेंट एजेंसी के झांसों में भी आ जाते हैं। लॉकडाउन में काम-धंधा बंद होने से इस तरह के मामलों में कमी आई। हालांकि, जिले में मार्च में ही बाल श्रम से जुड़े 29 कॉल चाइल्ड हेल्पलाइन नंबर पर आईं।

गौतमबुद्ध नगर में चाइल्ड हेल्पलाइन नंबर 1098 को संचालित करने वाली संस्था एफएक्सबी इंडिया सुरक्षा के कार्यक्रम प्रबंधक सत्य प्रकाश ने बताया कि बाल श्रम रोकना कड़ी चुनौती है। हेल्पलाइन नंबर पर कॉल आते ही तुरंत कार्रवाई की जाती है। कई मामलों में बच्चों को छुड़ाकर घर भेजा गया। अनलॉक-1 में काम-धंधे अभी शुरू हुए हैं। ऐसे में इस बीच बाल श्रम को लेकर कोई कॉल नहीं आई। लॉकडाउन में कई प्रवासी कामगार गृह राज्य चले गए। ये लोग महानगरों में कई वर्षों से रहते थे। बच्चे स्कूलों में पढ़ते थे। अब सवाल उठता है कि प्रवासी क्यों करेंगे? ऐसे में बच्चे मजदूरी व श्रम करने के लिए मजबूर होंगे। प्लेसमेंट एजेंसी वाले गरीबी का फायदा उठाकर बच्चों को घर, रेस्टोरेंट, होटल आदि में काम पर लगाएंगे।

मामला-एक: सत्य प्रकाश बताते हैं कि पहला मामला नोएडा में इसी वर्ष अप्रैल का है। यहां झुग्गियों में रहने वाली सात वर्ष की बच्ची के साथ यौन शोषण हो रहा था। इससे बच्ची की मौत हो गई थी। यौन शोषण करने वाला करीब 19 वर्ष का ममेरा भाई था। हेल्पलाइन नंबर पर कॉल मिलते ही पुलिस की मदद से आरोपित को गिरफ्तार कराया गया।

मामला-दो: मई में नोएडा के एक घर से 14 वर्ष के बच्चे को मुक्त कराया गया। बच्चे को आश्रय गृह भेज दिया गया है। पता चला कि बच्चे के पिता ने बिहार में आरोपित के रिश्तेदार से बेटी की शादी के लिए दो लाख रुपये लिए थे। इस वजह से बच्चे को घर में काम करना पड़ रहा था। उससे रोजाना 14 से 15 घंटे काम कराया जाता था।

## आरटीई के तहत कराया 38 बच्चों का दाखिला

जागरण संवाददाता, डेअर नोएडा : वंचित, गरीब तबके से आने वाले बच्चों को पढ़ाई का अधिकार बाल शिक्षा का अधिकार कानून (आरटीई) देता है। इसके तहत ये बच्चे किसी भी निजी बड़े स्कूल में पढ़ाई कर सकते हैं। हाल ही में जिले में ऐसे 3100 बच्चों का लॉटरी के तहत चयन किया गया। सामाजिक कार्यकर्ता श्वेता अग्रवाल ने भी प्रयास कर 38 बच्चों को निजी बड़े स्कूलों में दाखिला दिलाने की दिशा में कदम आगे बढ़ाया है। उनका कहना है कि दूसरे चरण में भी लगभग 20 बच्चों को कानून के तहत पढ़ाई करने का मौका मिलेगा।

श्वेता अग्रवाल जेपी ग्रोन्स में रहती हैं। वह ड्राप बाय ड्राप फाउंडेशन नामक संस्था चलाती हैं। वह बताती हैं कि पिछले वर्ष भी ऐसे वर्ग से आने वाले 70 बच्चों का दाखिला निजी बड़े स्कूलों में कराया था। श्वेता बताती हैं कि पहले इस कानून के बारे में नहीं पता था। किसी से पता चला कि गरीब व वंचित वर्ग के बच्चे भी बड़े निजी स्कूलों मुफ्त में पढ़ाई कर सकते हैं। इसके बाद जानकारी एकत्रित की। शुरुआत में काफी दिक्कत आई लेकिन प्रयास रंग लाया और 70 बच्चों का दाखिला कराने में सफल रहे। इस वर्ष भी पहली लॉटरी में 38 बच्चों

AROUND 8.45 pm Thursday, Noida Police received an urgent call from residents of an upscale apartment complex in Sector 104 about an abandoned baby, curled up inside a packet at the stairway exit of tower number 8. By the time police arrived, word had spread in ATS One Hamlet apartment complex about the

baby boy, who doctors say was barely a day-old when found.

"As soon as we got the call, we rushed with a team. Authorities were informed and the infant is currently admitted at the Child Super Speciality Hospital in sector 30. We are scanning CCTV footage to trace who dropped off the baby. So far, no complaint has been received," said Azad Singh Tomar, SHO of sector 39 police station. On Friday, doctors at the hos-

pital told *The Indian Express* that the boy is underweight at 1.8 kg. A True Nat test was also carried out which returned negative for Covid. The boy's platelets range around 91,000 and a course of antibiotics have been started. "The infant has not displaced any signs of fever or pneumonia but will remain admitted and under observation for a few days," said a doctor.

In the hospital corridor, a couple patiently waited. "We came



to know through our friend in the apartment complex that an infant has been found. We know it's a long process but we want to try adopting him," the couple told *The Indian Express*.

Before police arrived at the apartment complex Thursday night, a crowd had gathered near

tower 8 after his muffled cries were heard by a resident. At the hospital on Friday afternoon, a doctor said a request to Child helpline officials has been sent regarding the baby. Childline, a nodal agency of the Ministry of Women and Child Development, has been notified with regards to the transfer of the infant to a different facility.

Saty Prakash, Programme Manager, FXB India Suraksha, an NGO coordinating Childline ac-

tivities, told *The Indian Express*, "In all these years of rescuing abandoned children, this is the first time I have come across the case of a child being abandoned and found in a high-rise." He said "there is a good chance that the parents might be found".

"We are looking to shift the child to the government district hospital adjacent to the Child Speciality Hospital. He is too young to be kept in a shelter home," he said.

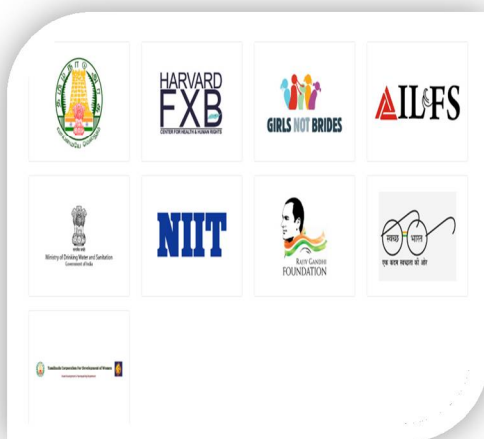
